**Method**: This should embrace the research design, population, sample and sampling techniques, instrument for data collection, procedure for data collection, and method of data analysis.

**Discussion**: Should contain the result and how it answers the research questions.

**Conclusion**: Should focus on the findings, conclusion and appropriate recommendations and contribution of knowledge.

**References**: The reference sections should normally contain a list of works cited in the body of the article using the latest American Psychological Association (APA) style (7<sup>th</sup> Edition).

**3.** Acceptable Length: Articles should not exceed 15 pages including tables, charts, appendices and references.

**4. Line Spacing**: Articles should be type-written double and printed on A-4 size paper. Three hard copies and one soft copy should be submitted.
